Wycliffe Foundation Receives \$1 Million Gift

ORLANDO, Fla., August 12, 2004—Wycliffe Foundation announced the receipt of \$1 million in a partial distribution of a trust from a donor in Oklahoma. The gift was undesignated and will be used to support Bible translation projects around the globe. The remainder of the gift is expected to add another million dollars for translation and literacy work.

“We appreciate the generosity of this donor who shared in the vision of seeing Bible translation begun in every language that needs it by year 2025,” said Mike Kennedy, director of gift planning and finance of the Wycliffe Foundation. “It demonstrates the devotion people have to get the gospel to the nearly 380 million people still waiting for it in their own language.”

He added that bequest commitments through trusts and wills are “very popular because they are easy to arrange and may be determined according to the donors’ interests.”

This is the largest gift the Wycliffe Foundation has received so far in its two-year history supporting global Bible translation and literacy efforts through gift planning.
